Privacy Policy

At the minimum, this usually includes information such as members' names, addresses and contact details. Additional information may be required, depending on the nature of your dealings with the Clubs. You can request details of any personal information the Club holds about you and advise us if it is inaccurate, incomplete or out-of-date.

We will only use or disclose your personal information for the primary purposes for which it was collected or as consented to. In the event we propose to use or disclose such personal information other than for reasons detailed within this policy, we will first seek your consent, where it is required, prior to such disclosure or use. Information will not be disclosed beyond this group of people unless you have provided written authorisation that The Club may do so, or unless required or authorised by law.

The information you provide will only be used for the purpose it was intended unless you have consented to the information being used for a secondary purpose, or part of the normal operations of the Club. The Club takes all reasonable security measures to protect information from loss, unauthorised access, destruction, misuse, modification or disclosure. As far as permissible under law, the Club accepts no responsibility for the unauthorised use of personal information held by it.
